Community Review

Umoja House

Umoja House was established in 1988.

It opened as a response to the need for black-led hostel provision. Umoja has been going strong for 8 years, and during this time it has secured permanent accommodation for the majority of its residents.

Umoja recognizes the importance of having a staff team that young people can identify with. The need and demand for Umoja has continued to rise and has led to the expansion of the staff team.

Umoja's aim is to empower all of the young people who require our service. It operates a climate of respect, acceptance and encouragement so that each young person can reach their full potential. Umoja House aims to provide a service for all young Black and Asian people for as long as we are needed. It is hoped it will continue to receive support from voluntary and statutory agencies, as well as the local community.

The role of Umoja

To provide a service for single Afro-Caribbean and Asian young people aged 16-25 years who are experiencing homelessness.

To provide temporary short-term accommodation up to one year.

To provide practical advice and support with specific issues, such as housing and benefits, to residents and ex-residents.

To encourage self-help and independence. To provide move-on support for residents when they take up their own tenancies.

To develop links and maintain links and contacts, with relevant statutory and voluntary agencies.

Owing to heavy demand, Umoja has to operate a waiting list.

Community Role Models Social Workers in the Community

At last something positive is being done about the increasing failure of the British education system to address the problems of black youngsters (mostly boys) who have been excluded from school.

At present, a disproportionately high number of pupils excluded from school are black and male. Many parents of West Indian origin whose own parents are still in the West Indies are sending their children to the West Indies to be cared for by their grandparents and educated in a more disciplined environment. But although it's good for children to see their grandparents for a holiday, it can't be right for them to be separated from their own parents during their formative years because of the lack of educational facilities geared towards them.

The Watoto Project has been set up to deal with this problem. It was set up by Chevi Chiverton and Sherman Hill. One of its tasks will be to organize one-day courses for teachers, careers, council workers and other people in authority in order to help them understand black culture. Another is to give counselling and guidance to individuals. Another is to liaise with a voluntary organization in London which aims to promote positive images of black male teenagers.

Positive News URBAN Partnership Group

The UPG is now firmly established as the driving force of the Urban Initiative. The UPG is responsible for the implementation of the Urban Initiative in Harehills and Chapeltown and will be closely involved in deciding priorities for action. Its first task is to prepare an Action Plan by the beginning of April which will help in the decision-making process.

There are eight community representatives on the UPG to ensure that URBAN genuinely responds to local needs and priorities. They were elected last January at a public meeting in Harehills Place Community Centre, attended by local people from across Harehills and Chapeltown.

The UPG is chaired by Harehills Councillor John Clare who is chair of Leeds City Councilis Employment and Economic Development Committee. It is a real partnership between local people, councillors and representative of key local agencies.

Local people influence development of URBAN.

Meetings were held at the West Indian Centre and Bangladeshi Community Centre before Christmas to provide information about URBAN and allow people to highlight the needs of the area. Altogether well over 100 local people have so far been involved in setting the scene for URBAN. A wide range of issues were raised at the community meetings and these will contribute towards the preparation of the Action Plan.

Key issues raised at the meetings included:

- URBAN should tackle the poor image that the area has in the eyes of the outside world.
- People should have more information and support to allow them to compete for the new jobs that are being created in Leeds
- The communities of Chapeltown and Harehills have real strengths and skills. URBAN should build on these to create a virtuous circle of regeneration rather than a vicious circle of disadvantage.

URBAN Action Plan

The UPG has set up three working groups to develop the Action Plan around the key objectives. The working groups will work with other agencies and organizations in the area to prepare a draft Action Plan which will then be sent out for local consultation.

About £3 million of European money will be available to support the key objectives of the Chapeltown and Harehills URBAN Initiative which are:

Local capacity building to improve the ability of individuals and local organizations to play a full role in the URBAN Initiative and in the regeneration of the area;

Regenerating Chapeltown and Harehills to encourage business investment, create new jobs, enhance community facilities and improve safety in the area;

Increasing employment prospects for local people to improve the skills of unemployed people and remove barriers to employment.

The £3 million will be matched by further public and private money. The European Commission has put special emphasis on the involvement of local people in the URBAN Initiative and in the regeneration of their communities.

Leeds Construction & Training Agency (LCATA) was established in 1996 by Leeds Partnership Homes to deliver government funded programmes (SRB2) to the urban renewal areas of Beeston, Burley, Chapeltown, Harehilis and Hyde Park.

Not just another Agency...

Geraldine Delaney, Project Director, explains that CATA has much more to offer than just bricks and mortar and is determined to build on its achievements.

The aim of the Agency is to get local contractors on to the housing associations' approved contractor lists and help them through the minefield of paperwork. CATA has unique access to over 25% of housing association contracts and to date, has harnessed at least £400,000 of work for local contractors.

'We are already seeing an increase in construction related vacancies and new businesses as a result of additional work that local contractors have accessed'.

The Agency can also offer a whole range of tailored support and training for businesses and individuals working in construction. From NVQs to Health & Safety training, the support provided enables local contractors to compete effectively for local contracts. To date over 120 local contractors have benefited from accredited training arranged by CATA.

The programme aims to provide support, training <u>and</u> <u>jobs</u>, and is working in partnership with the housing associations in the delivery of new housing and with Care and Repair, Leeds who offer a range of services to the local community, including energy efficiency and safety and security works.
